

ADOPTION APPLICATION

To be considered to adopt you must:

- Be 25 years of age or older
- Have identification and a utility bill showing your present address
- If renting, have the knowledge and written consent of your landlord
- Be able and willing to spend the time and money necessary to provide training, medical treatment and proper care of a dog/cat for the rest of his/her life.

Adoption Process

- 1. Adoption Application: Fill out and return the adoption application to us at info@muttmatchla.org muttmatchla@aol.com or by snail mail to: Mutt Match L.A. Rescue, 16654 Soledad Canyon Road #285, Canyon Country, CA 91387. Please keep in mind, we consider all applications in the order they are received.
- 2. Meet & Greet: After your application is approved, you will be contacted to schedule a meet for your dog of interest. Everyone living in the house must attend the initial meet & greet, agree upon adopting your dog of interest.
- 3. Home check: While a home visit is required prior to placement, it does not guarantee adoption. We like to see where our dogs will be living which gives us peace of mind they will be in a safe secure environment and be living as beloved family members. Often we can help with unforeseen health and safety risks that potential adopters may not be aware of.
- 4. Adoption contract: The adoption contract is a binding agreement between the adopter and Mutt Match LA. A copy will be emailed prior to the home check to discuss any questions or concerns.
- 5. Adoption Fee. In many cases, we have already spent hundreds of dollars on vet bills and care for each dog. The donation helps us re-coup a small fraction of those costs. There is a \$350 adoption fee for puppies 8 weeks - 4 years, \$300 5 - 8 years and \$250 for dogs over 8 years. Adoption fee covers spay/neuter (with our vet), *vaccinations, microchip, a wellness check, any additional medical expenses necessary incurred by rescue and of course all the love and daily care we take with each dog before they are adopted.
- *Vaccinations (up to the point of adoption) in the case of puppies, additional booster vaccinations & rabies may be required and incurred by adopter.
- 6. Training: Training is an IMPORTANT part of a dog's well being. Most of the dogs we rescue are from neglectful homes, stressful shelters or they have been living and surviving on the streets. We see the same heart breaking scenarios over and over which sadly ends with wonderful dogs being euthanized because of something as simple as dog training (or lack of it.). We are passionate and committed to dog training and education and work hard to set each dog off on a successful start in there new home therefore training is part of our adoption requirements. In additional training fee is required and paid directly to one of our approved trainers. We work with some of LA's best trainers but if you have a trainer you prefer or have worked with in the past, we will take that into consideration to meet our requirement.

ADOPTION QUESTIONNAIRE
